<i>Policy Area</i>	Impact	What to Expect
<i>Trade Relations and Tariffs</i>	Potential tariff hikes and trade restrictions could impact Indian exports to the U.S., affecting supply chains and logistics operations. *Especially Agri sector	Disruptions in trade flows to the U.S., requiring adjustments in supply chain models and logistics operations.
<i>Infrastructure Investment and U.S.-India Trade Facilitation</i>	Increased demand for Indian logistics providers if the U.S. prioritizes partnerships with India for regional supply chains.	Increased opportunities for Indian logistics providers in global supply chain solutions, particularly for U.S.-India partnerships.
<i>Focus on Manufacturing in the U.S. (Reshoring)</i>	Reshoring of manufacturing to the U.S. may reduce demand for certain Indian-made goods, impacting logistics operations for exports.	A shift in focus to new markets or domestic logistics due to reduced exports to the U.S.
<i>Regulatory Changes and Customs Protocols</i>	Stricter regulations on imports and customs procedures could lead to longer lead times and higher operational costs for Indian logistics providers.	Need for enhanced compliance management systems and longer lead times for shipments due to stricter customs regulations.
<i>Energy and Fuel Policies</i>	Fluctuating fuel prices due to U.S. focus on fossil fuels could increase transportation costs for Indian logistics companies, especially for road and shipping.	Increased operational costs, particularly for transportation, unless fuel-efficient or alternative transport options are adopted.
<i>Environmental and Sustainability Policies</i>	Rollbacks on climate change and sustainability regulations in the U.S. could pose challenges for Indian logistics companies trying to align with global environmental standards.	Challenges in aligning with sustainability standards if U.S. policies on climate change become less stringent.
